Experience and know-how are valuable assets to any organization. SAVE is fortunate to have many staff who have worked here for 20 plus years, but we're also lucky to have several consumers who have been at SAVE a long time.

One of them is Mike L. Mike came to SAVE in the summer of 1975, right out of High School. At that time SAVE wasn't exactly what we see now.

Mike remembers well. "I started at the old Belleville workshop right by the railroad tracks," he said. "I worked there, and I worked at the East St. Louis workshop when they needed help. I always like to help out."

Mike brought his helpful attitude and versatile skills to SAVE's Turkey Hill site in the early 1980's, and has worked on most of the jobs and most of the assignments we have. He's currently assigned to building 102, where we work on the license plate stickers for the Illinois Secretary of State's office, as well as other contracts.

Mike offered some history on that particular building. "That never used to be the license sticker building. It was the Stag building, and before that we mixed grain there for another contract."

In his time at SAVE Mike has also worked on our Grounds Crew and on a couple of different jobs with our Janitorial Service Program. Mike said that he liked the variety he's experienced at SAVE. "It's good to do different things, right? That way you don't get burned out doing the same thing all the time."

Having interests outside of work is another way to keep a fresh outlook, and Mike has long participated in Special Olympics. The last several years he's taken part in O.U.R Program recreational activities. "I do track and field, and bowling, and basketball when we have a team," Mike said. "O.U.R. Program is pretty much fun, too."

Mike wrapped up by saying that he wanted to continue being active and to continue at SAVE. "I like to do things," Mike said. "I want to keep coming to SAVE. I'm not ready to retire."

Those seem like good words to live by. Here's to wishing Mike many more years involvement with SAVE programs.

They quickly saw her potential and dedication and made her part of the regular night stocking team. Through the job club and coaching provided by the JOBTrack staff, Nicole received the encouragement and self-confidence to succeed and look forward to the future.

Bobby's future is bright with hope and promise thanks to the education and training he has received from the S.A.V.E. staff, his high school teachers and his family. With great support and encouragement, Bobby is a successful member of the food court janitorial and maintenance staff at St. Clair Square Mall. His supervisor has commented that he is an excellent worker who always focuses on completing his assigned tasks.

Arhonda was a successful educator with an outstanding military service record and a bright future until she had a severe stroke. Suddenly incapacitated, she became depressed and unsure how she could care for her four teenage daughters. By working with the JOBTrack staff, her resilient spirit was lifted, and she renewed her dedication to overcoming her difficulties. She is now the secretary/receptionist at S.A.V.E.'s Illinois North site and has become a member of our family. Arhonda has turned down other employment because, as she says, "S.A.V.E. helped me to regain my life. I enjoy working here, and I want to help others."

JOBTrack is an important part of our efforts to help adults with disabilities reach their highest potential and fulfill their dreams. We are deeply indebted to the JobTrack staff: Paul Wibbenmeyer, Program Manager, and his colleagues Dee Andrews and Cindy Rehg for their dedicated efforts to help those in need.

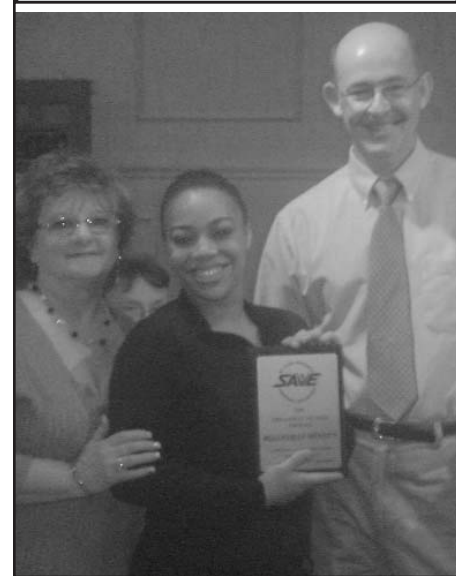

I recently had a person say to me, "Jim, I'd like to help S.A.V.E. through my estate, but I don't want to deprive my heirs."

We began talking about ways to give. Over the course of the conversation, this person shared that he had a paid up life insurance policy. It had been taken out when his children were young to provide for their care in case something happened to him. Thankfully, the policy really wasn't needed anymore since the children were grown and had sufficient personal income.

I shared with him that life insurance can be an easy and flexible way to make an important gift to S.A.V.E. that provides resources far into the future.

Possible ways life insurance can be used to benefit and sustain S.A.V.E.'s important mission include:

- **Make S.A.V.E. a beneficiary of an existing life insurance policy.**

Upon your death the face value amount of the policy will go to S.A.V.E. Just request a beneficiary designation form from the insurance company.

- **Make S.A.V.E. the owner and beneficiary of an already existing paid up life insurance policy.** Since S.A.V.E. becomes the owner of the policy, the proceeds are not included in the donor's estate for tax purposes. Furthermore, you may be entitled to a charitable contribution tax deduction based on the fair market value of the policy.

- **Donate excess coverage from a group term life insurance policy through your workplace.** Giving excess coverage benefits is an excellent way to provide valuable funds to S.A.V.E. without any cost to the
